Following the incident, he was treated at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC) and spent considerable time in the Soldier Recovery Unit (SRU).

During his recovery, SGT Robinson embarked on a remarkable physical and emotional transformation, utilizing the support and resources of the SRU to regain his strength and endurance. He is now eager to represent Team Army in the Warrior Games, viewing his participation as a testament to his personal growth, resilience, and camaraderie. These games are not just athletic events for SGT Robinson but milestones in a journey marked by perseverance and support from his family and the SRU community.
